Principal projects and grants

The Stichting Henri Moerel provides grants to a number of organisations with which it has a long-term relationship, which allows these organisations to create and maintain multi-year programs. The principal organisations are Musica en Segura, The Yehudi Menuhin Competition, The Young Pianist Foundation, The Yehudi Menuhin School, Southbank Sinfonia and new in 2022 is Music Masters. In addition, we support several individual musicians, also as part of a program of long-term relationships.

Other The Stichting Henri Moerel owns a number of instruments. The Nicolo Gagliano violin is on a long-term loan to Diana Adamyan, a first prize winner of the Yehudi Menuhin Competition and the Khachaturian Violin Competition. The Steinway grand piano and other instruments are on loan to Southbank Sinfonia, London.
